## The safety of our students depends on you

At school, your child learns about road safety. Help them practice the road safety messages they learn by using and sharing them whenever you're out and about.



#### To lead by example, you should always:

- Drive around the block if you cannot enter the Stop, Drop & Go. Stopping while waiting for your turn to enter the Stop, Drop & Go is considered a "stopping offence", as this disrupts the flow of traffic and puts your child/ren's safety at risk
- · Avoid stopping in the school's driveway or surrounding resident's driveways or grassed footpaths
- Not stop in a school bus zone
- · Drive to last bay in the Stop, Drop & Go
- Observe the two-minute time limit within the Stop, Drop & Go zone and all timed carparks
- Use a parking bay and not the Stop, Drop & Go if you wish to exit your vehicle for longer than two

#### Offences in school zones include:

- · Stopping on side of road marked with a yellow line
- · Stopping on a traffic/painted island
- Parking longer than indicated on signage
- Stop on/near pedestrian/marked foot crossing
- Stop in/at/near bus stop
- Double parked stopping between the centre of the road and another vehicle
- Stop on/near children's crossing
- · Disobey no parking/stopping sign
- · Stop on path/footpath/nature strip in built-up area
- · Stop on/across driveway/other access to/from land
